This is by officer patrol of LLCS locations in south London. Separate from the LLCS there are CCTV cameras located on Hilliers Lane, operated by the Safer Sutton Partnership for the purposes of Sutton community safety. However as these cameras have the potential to record vehicle movements officers are currently investigating whether these cameras can be used for enforcement of the LLCS. If it is not possible to use these cameras officers are looking at the feasibility of using an ANPR camera for a period of enforcement.	1/12/15
