1. Summary

- 1.1 This report updates the Health and Wellbeing Board on progress in relation to Sutton's Mental Health Crisis Care Concordat. This follows from an earlier presentation on mental health services to the Board in 2014.

2. Recommendations

The Health & Wellbeing Board is recommended to:

- 2.2 Agree to the updating of the plan on the national crisis care concordat website.

3. Background

- 3.1 In February 2014, the government published a national Mental Health Crisis Concordat. This was supported by a range of national stakeholders which was broader than previous policy developments. The broad aim of this was to improve and extend the availability of mental health crisis services and shift the balance of crisis responses so that more support is available in community settings and primary care, and previously excluded groups, such as those with substance misuse problems, are able to access crisis services.



3.2 The concordat required that each local area set up its own Crisis Care Concordat implementation group, whose membership mirrored the broad stakeholder interest groups of the national concordat. Sutton’s Crisis Concordat Steering Group has been meeting since 29 February 2016.
