# How to Report an abandoned vehicle to Sutton Council

A vehicle is probably abandoned if:

- it's no longer taxed
- it's been in the same spot for a long time - eg more than 3 weeks
- it's damaged with flat tyres, wheels removed or broken windows
- it's burnt out
- the number plates are missing

# How to Report an abandoned vehicle to Sutton Council

To report an untaxed vehicle on a public road, you'll need to give:

- the date the tax was due
- the vehicle's make, model, registration number (shown on the number plate) and colour
- the street where the vehicle is (or nearest street)
- your contact details in case we have difficulty locating the vehicle
